# **IMPORTANT NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS**

## **DOG LICENSES DUE JANUARY 1<sup>ST</sup>**

MALE OR FEMALE	\$11.00
NEUTERED MALE OR SPAYED FEMALE	\$6.00

\*2026 Licensed Dogs: 155      Unlicensed Dogs +/- 141

A valid rabies certificate issued within 3 years, and a certificate of neutering, if applicable, are necessary for licensing. Partial license fees for neutered dogs will be retained by the Town to help defray expenses of animal control. License fees for intact female and male dogs will be sent to the State Department of Agriculture.

### **TITLE 7, 703: (3921 & 3922) LICENSE NECESSARY**

No dog shall be kept within the limits of this State unless such dogs have been licensed by its owner in accordance with the laws of Maine.

“Owner” means any person or persons, firm association, or corporation owning, keeping or harboring a dog.

### **(3455) DOGS DO NOT RUN AT LARGE**

It shall be unlawful for the owner of any dog, licensed or unlicensed, to permit such dog to run at large, except when used for hunting.

“**At large**” means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person by means of personal presence and attention as will reasonably control the conduct of such dog.

### **(3929-A, sub-4) LATE FEES (as of March 26, 2010)**

An owner or keeper required to license a dog and applying for a license for that dog after January 31<sup>st</sup> shall pay to the municipal clerk or dog recorder a late fee of **\$25** in addition to the annual license fee.

## **SMITHFIELD ORDINANCE**

An ordinance was enacted in 1977 that requires the owner of any dog found in Violation of Section 3455 of the State of Maine Revised Statutes, Title 7, chapter 703, known as “The Leash Law” pay the Treasurer of Smithfield the Sum of \$15.00 to defray the costs of the Town for the enforcement of said law.

### **Frequently Asked Questions about the Animal Welfare Program**

#### **What is the purpose of the Animal Welfare Program?**

The primary purpose of the Animal Welfare Program is to ensure that animals in Maine are humanely and properly treated. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry has developed, implemented and administered a comprehensive program to uphold the animal welfare laws through communication, education, and enforcement.

#### **How is the Animal Welfare Program funded?**

The majority of funding for the Animal Welfare Program comes from the licensing of dogs and various facilities such as animal shelters, boarding kennels, breeding kennels, pet shops, and research facilities, pet and livestock food registration, tax check off, and the Animal Welfare License plates.

#### **Why should I license my dog?**

Dog licensing has been an important part of combating the spread of rabies in the United States. The fee that you pay goes toward helping fund our animal control program and the animal welfare program. The tag your dog wears helps to identify the dog in the case that it gets lost.

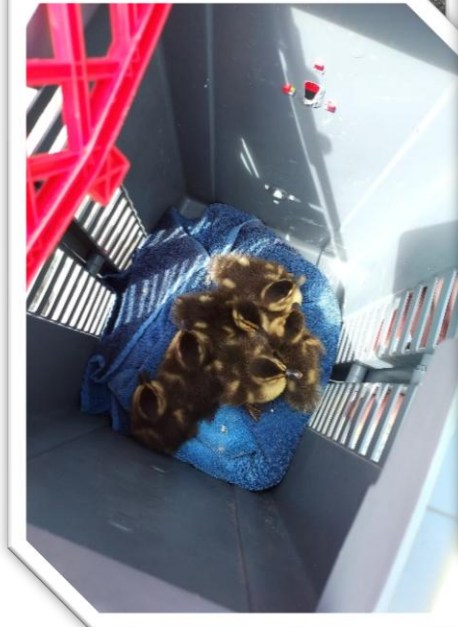
#### **When should I license my dog?**

You may purchase a license for the upcoming year beginning on October 15th. The deadline to purchase your dog's license is January 31. After January 31, a late fee of \$25 is incurred.

#### **Do I have to license my cat?**

There is no requirement to license a cat; however cats are required to have a current rabies vaccination. All dogs and cats in the State of Maine are required to have current rabies shots administered by a licensed veterinarian.

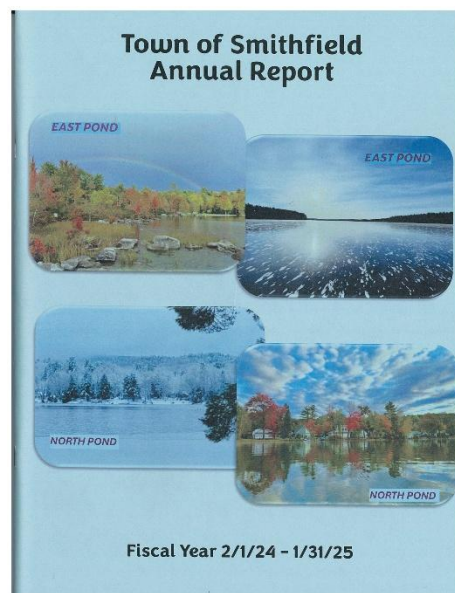
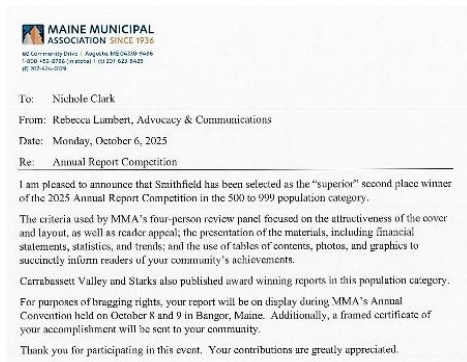

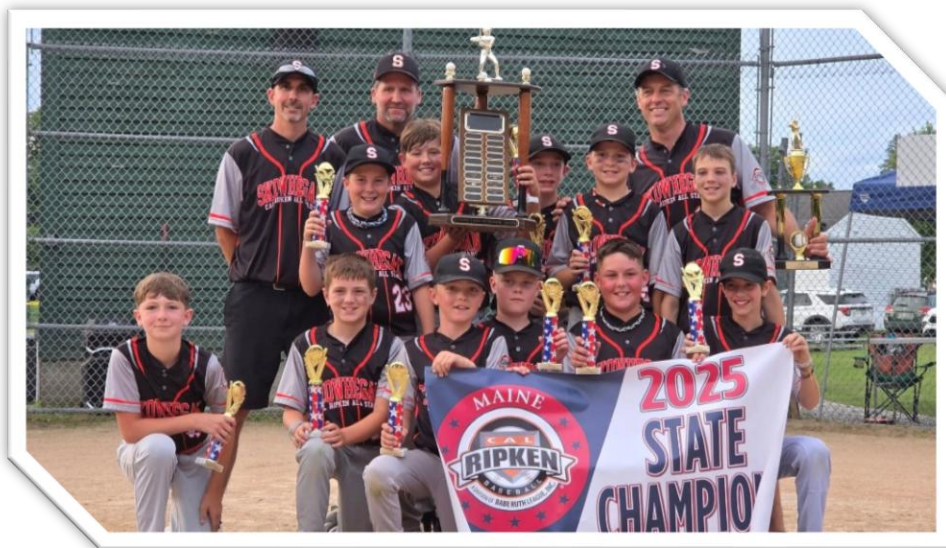

## Smithfield Volunteer Fire & Rescue Department



Dear Residents,

Another year has concluded for the Smithfield Fire and Rescue Department, marked by continued dedication and service to our community. Under the leadership of Fire Chief Louis Batista, our officers and firefighters have worked diligently to ensure the safety of our town and the efficient operation of the department.

Throughout the year, our members devoted countless hours to emergency responses, administrative responsibilities, training, meetings, and compliance with state and local regulations. The department is always seeking new volunteers. All necessary training is provided, and there are many ways to assist and contribute. Department meetings are held every Sunday at 10:00 a.m. at the fire station, and we welcome all who are interested.

In the past year, the department responded to a total of 180 calls for service, including:

- Over 100 medical emergency responses
- More than 30 motor vehicle accidents
- Over 20 mutual aid calls
- 8 calls involving trees down, wires down, or roadway obstructions
- 18 in-town fire-related incidents, including structure fires, outbuilding fires, grass fires, carbon monoxide alarms, and fire alarms
- 3 water-related responses
- 1 ice rescue
- 1 mutual aid response assisting with an injured hiker on Mount Phillips

The department also hosted its annual chicken barbecue, which was once again well attended. We greatly appreciate the continued support from the community and look forward to hosting this event again in the future.

We respectfully remind residents to ensure that house numbers are clearly visible from the roadway in both directions. Large, reflective, and contrasting numbers are strongly recommended, as they assist emergency responders in locating residences quickly.

Residents are also encouraged to check and replace batteries in all smoke detectors and carbon monoxide alarms as needed. Please verify the expiration dates of these devices, as most have a service life of ten years.

In closing, I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to the members of the Smithfield Fire and Rescue Department, the town's Administrative Assistant, the Select Board, the Fire Association, and all residents for their continued support throughout the year.

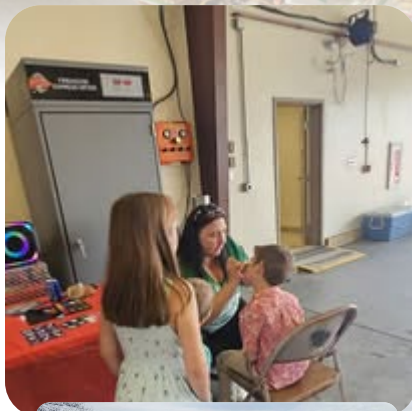

## Select Board Report 2025

Dear Citizens,

As we reflect on the past year, we would like to share several positive developments and milestones in Smithfield. These efforts represent the ongoing work of town officials, volunteers, and residents committed to supporting our community.

- The Smithfield Fire Department received a \$50,000 grant to purchase cold-water rescue gear and equipment and members completed specialized cold-water rescue training. We are grateful to our firefighters for their tireless dedication and for continually strengthening the services that keep our community safe.
- Our Planning Board completed a Comprehensive Plan, an important milestone that will help guide the town's future growth and decision-making. This work also positions Smithfield to pursue additional grant opportunities. We thank the members of the Planning Board for the many hours of thoughtful, careful work they invested on behalf of the town.
- The Smithfield Moonshiners Snowmobile Club placed a storage shed at the ballfield to house their trail-grooming equipment. We appreciate the Club's ongoing commitment to maintaining safe winter recreation and for contributing to the upkeep and improvement of community property.
- During periods of extreme weather, we opened a community cooling and heating center to ensure residents had a safe and comfortable place to go. We also gratefully received a bottled water donation from the Somerset County Emergency Management Agency Drought Task Force. These efforts reflect the spirit of neighbors looking out for one another.
- We would also like to recognize Smithfield resident Tim Covert, who has attended nearly every Select Board meeting this term. His consistent participation and thoughtful feedback on issues both large and small exemplify the kind of civic engagement that strengthens our town.
- In August, Second Selectperson Julie Stevens-Giroux resigned from the Board. We thank Julie for her service to Smithfield. A special election was held in November, and we welcome Danielle Keay to the Select Board. In early 2026, we also welcomed two new members to our Budget Committee, Regina Lenfest and Derek Downing, who stepped in and immediately began contributing their time and energy.

Smithfield continues to thrive because of the dedication of its volunteers, employees, and engaged citizens. We are proud to serve this community and remain committed to working together for a strong and vibrant year ahead.

We wish all of our residents a wonderful 2026–2027 and look forward to serving you in the coming year.

## **2025 Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) Report**

36 intents to build permits were issued in 2025. New construction consisted of 12 houses, 16 accessory structures, 7 additions and 1 multifamily dwelling unit.

The Department of Environmental Protection "Permit-by-Rule", process has been relaxed after last year's changes regarding abutter notification. Now only immediate abutters and the municipal office must be notified at the time of submittal, not all abutters within 1,000 feet. A Permit-By-Rule is required when doing earthmoving work within 75' of a lake, pond or wetland.

Shoreline erosion and ice damaged trees can be removed from Shoreland Zone areas after consulting with the Code Enforcement Officer, and a replanting plan has been discussed. Damage to shorelines and erosion of camp roads may qualify for Grant assistance for repair and prevention of future erosion. Contact 7 Lakes Alliance, (207) 495-6039, for a free assessment and more information.

## 2025 Licensed Plumbing Inspector (LPI) Report

18 permits for septic work and 15 permits for internal plumbing were issued in 2025. Internal plumbing encompasses new construction, renovations, additions, water softeners and repairs. Septic work can be new construction, expansion or repairs to failed septic fields or faulty tanks and drain lines.

The State has made changes to its regulations pertaining to temporary portable toilets. Permits are no longer required; however, proof of maintenance is required. Most portable toilets are rented and maintained under contract, so the contract is the proof required. As in most situations, keep good communication with your local plumbing inspector.

**Outdoor showers and all other plumbing fixtures must have a water collection device that connects to a sanitary disposal system.** This is a general rule in the 2021 Universal Plumbing Code adopted by the State of Maine. Gray water is wastewater; it must be treated as such. Open drains also promote phosphorus run-off as it loosens and displaces soil. Be lake friendly and correct any outdoor plumbing issues, there is no “grandfathering” of preexisting plumbing violations.

All the area lakes have had algae blooms to some extent. These concerns are not isolated to one lake and do not go away by themselves. All of us need to do our part to make water quality better.

# North Pond Association Annual Report 2025



## Water Quality Overview

Thankfully, North Pond did not experience an algal bloom this past summer – a welcome reprieve for all who enjoy and care for the watershed. With last summer’s drought, there was less rainwater runoff to carry phosphorus into the pond. Low oxygen at the pond bottom leads to the release of phosphorus from the sediment which feeds the algae; however, this summer, oxygen levels at the pond bottom were restored by mixing events due to cool nights and strong winds. Despite this encouraging development, sediment-bound phosphorus levels remain elevated and future blooms are a near certainty. The recently installed water quality monitor will enhance forecasting capabilities and inform evaluation of an Alum treatment to address the internal phosphorus loading.

## North Pond Remediation Fund

The North Pond Remediation Fund is essential to advancing long-term restoration of the water quality and the prevention of algal blooms. We are continuing our fundraising efforts in several ways. As of December, our Remediation Fund totalled over \$870,000.

You may recall that the full Senate did not pass the \$2.3 million in Congressionally Directed Spending funds for 2025 that Senator Susan Collins advanced through the Senate Appropriations Committee. We wish to express our gratitude to 7 Lakes Alliance (7LA) in reapplying for Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) funds for 2026 and to Senator Susan Collins for again advancing the *Community Action Plan to Restore Water Quality to North Pond* through the Senate Appropriations Committee. Should the full Senate approve the measure, the resulting \$2.3 million grant combined with the matching funds raised by our community positions North Pond as “shovel-ready” for an Alum treatment. As noted in our recent email blast, we hope that many NPA members and other stewards of North Pond and Little Pond will write to Senator Collins encouraging her to urge her fellow Senators to pass the CDS funds.

Please note that a portion of remediation funds are for preventative measures. A LakeSmart evaluation is an excellent tool for property owners to learn how to minimize rainwater run-off which can carry phosphorus into the lake. ## **Invasive Aquatic Program: Invasive Plant Remediation and Courtesy Boat Inspection (CBI)**

The invasive aquatic plant Curly-Leaf Pondweed (CLPW) has been identified throughout most regions of North Pond. Remediation efforts, led by Sharon Mann at 7LA, require specially trained divers and will continue for the foreseeable future. Boaters are asked to exercise caution near marked buoys and dive teams, particularly during peak summer activity, to support containment and removal efforts. Remediation is expensive, costing the NPA \$10,000 in 2025, and that figure will be higher in 2026.

Paid and volunteer CBIs inspected 811 boats at the public launch in an effort to prevent unwanted invasives from entering North Pond. Fortunately, no invasive plants were found on boats entering or leaving North Pond. Bottle redemption money from the boat at Tri-Pond Variety goes toward the Invasive Aquatics Program.

### **319 Grant Projects**

Administered by the Maine DEP, this program provides matching funds for erosion control projects. The money is available to homeowners, road associations, businesses, and towns. This program is coordinated by Lynn Geiger, Erosion Control Policy Manager at 7 LakesAlliance assisted by YCC Coordinator, Stuart Cole. North Pond projects in 2025 included 8 residential projects and 10 road projects 5 of which were joint projects with Smithfield, Rome, and Mercer. Over the 2024-2025 cycle, the road improvements have prevented an estimated 54 tons of sediment (which carries phosphorus) from entering the pond.

### **Dam Petition**

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection has released a **draft** decision regarding the dam petition to establish a water level regime and/or minimum flows for North Pond through the dam on Great Meadow Stream. The draft order essentially aligns with the current management of the dam by the NPA. The full draft report is available on the NPA website under the Public Files section. Once a final ruling is released, the NPA website will be updated.

## Community Engagement

- North Pond community volunteers participated in *Plant Paddles* held throughout the summer. These paddles, led by Sharon Mann, Invasive Aquatics Director at 7LA, identified the areas of CLPW and marked them with colorful noodle buoys.
- A LakeSmart Buff Enough workshop was held as our 1st *Summer Solstice Party* on June 21st to promote community awareness of the causes of phosphorus entering the pond. Attendees enjoyed ice cream and the educational program.
- The NPA sponsored an ice fishing derby in February with cash prizes of \$500, \$200, and \$100 for the top 3 pike and a lifetime fishing license for the top junior winner.
- On December 12th, we held our second *Festive Silent Auction*. The NPA extends sincere appreciation to the businesses and individuals who donated auction items. Many thanks to Jodie Mosher for her leadership and dedication in bringing this community event to the Fairview Grange in Smithfield. We raised a total of \$5,005.36 for the fund!
- The NPA website features regular updates on current initiatives. We encourage you to stay informed and participate in ongoing stewardship activities benefiting North and Little North Ponds.

## EAST POND ASSOCIATION 2025 REPORT

The East Pond Association (EPA) would like to thank the citizens of Smithfield for their support. Your donation to our Courtesy Boat Inspectors (CBI) Program helps to fund one of our largest expenditures. In 2025, our goal was to man the public boat launch for 12 hours each day from Memorial Day through Labor Day with reduced hours through Indigenous Peoples Day. Using paid inspectors and volunteers (covering almost 200 hours) from the EPA, 1,315 boats were inspected and 12 plant fragments were collected for further study. Luckily, none of these fragments were found to be an invasive plant species. The total cost to the EPA for the 2025 season was \$17,613.60 which will increase in 2026 due to changes in minimum wages. While this is a substantial cost, we know that **Prevention costs much less than treating an Infestation.**



### **The EPA is also active in the following areas:**

- Invasive Plant detection including 2 full lake Plant Paddles annually, the Adopt-A-Shoreline program as well as supporting the 7 Lakes Alliance Dive Team who inspected and pulled Curly-leaf pondweed in the Serpentine from April until October..
- Monthly participation in the Belgrade Dams Committee.
- An East Pond Watershed Survey was completed by surveying shore land properties with the help of 7 Lakes Alliance and the Maine DEP. This plan, requiring an update every 10 years, will allow the EPA to apply for 319 Grants that can be used to support efforts to control erosion and keep phosphorus from entering the lake.
- Water quality testing, including Secchi Disk readings, taken by educated volunteers are used by Colby College and 7 Lakes Alliance to study long term water quality conditions.
- We promote lakefront property improvements using Best Management Practices through the Picture Perfect program.
- Education and Communication continue throughout the year with our Annual Meeting, Newsletter, email blasts and distribution of Welcome Packets to new residents. We maintain the eastpond.org website and social media pages.
- Encourage monetary support of the East Pond Preservation Fund so that we can be ready to address water quality issues in the future.

**All of this work and much more is done by a volunteer board of directors and a great group of active members that are dedicated to “Keeping East Pond Perfect”.**

Dear Town of Smithfield and its residents,

7 Lakes Alliance thanks the Town of Smithfield and its residents for your continued partnership and funding support for our Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) and Courtesy Boat Inspection (CBI) programs. These efforts play a vital role in preventing and addressing soil erosion that contributes to harmful algae blooms, as well as preventing the spread of invasive aquatic plants.

In addition to operating these programs, 7 Lakes leverages private and public funding and strong community support to restore and protect local waters while supporting the recreational, economic, and ecological values that benefit the entire region. We work closely with many partners, including the North Pond and East Pond Associations, to ensure these efforts are effective and locally driven.

We are pleased to share highlights from our 2025 season with you below.

- The YCC completed 69 projects across all 7 waterfront towns, installing 133 Best Management Practices (BMPs), such as infiltration paths and vegetative buffers. 15 high school and college-aged crew members were employed for the summer, gaining skills and learning about lake conservation.
- The YCC completed projects on 6 properties in Smithfield, installing 10 BMPs to directly address erosion on North Pond. Over \$18,000 was invested in erosion control improvements in the town, including \$7,600 from 7 Lakes in-kind. There are more projects planned in Smithfield for the 2026 season.
- 7 Lakes completed Phase IV of the North Pond Watershed Restoration Project (2024-2025). \$112,410 of federal funding was awarded for Phase IV, via Section 319 of the Clean Water Act. \$36,911 of those federal funds were invested in infrastructure improvements in Smithfield, including \$17,251 spent on town roads. With local matches, the total impact in Smithfield was \$75,380.
- The next Section 319 grant has been awarded and will begin in October of 2026. Phase V will include \$110,820 of federal funding for North Pond watershed improvements.
- 7 Lakes Alliance employed 43 CBIs, and had the help of 23 volunteers to get a total of

7,735 inspection hours and 16,483 boat inspections across the 7 motorized boat launches in the Belgrade Lakes Watershed.

- CBI's at the North Pond and East Pond boat launches covered 1,873 hours, with a group of dedicated volunteers at both launches covering 197 of these hours. There were 54 plant fragments prevented from entering or leaving North and East pond, none of which were identified as invasive.
- 7 Lakes divers spent 2,256 hours underwater surveying for and removing invasive curly-leaf pondweed from the East Pond Serpentine and North Pond.
- The Lake Science team conducted year-round water quality monitoring on all 7 lakes in 2025, where we made 45 full monitoring visits between East and North Ponds. These monitoring visits amounted to 476 lake water samples, as well as measurements of water clarity, temperature, oxygen, and algae dynamics. Additionally, 330 stream water samples were collected from East and North Pond streams with help from several Smithfield residents, and multiple sediment cores were taken on areas across both lakes. These samples were collected and analyzed with our partners at Colby College, and the data will inform water quality management.
- This year we expanded our invasive aquatic plant education beyond our regular invasive plant workshops to invasive tours on our education boat, as well as reaching local schools and summer camps.
- Across plant ID workshops, summer camps and school programs, plant paddles, and educational tours on our boat, we reached 276 people this year.

We look forward to continuing our work with the Town of Smithfield and its residents to protect the economic, ecological, recreational, and community benefits that healthy waters provide for all. We welcome questions and input at any time and can be reached at (207) 495-6039.

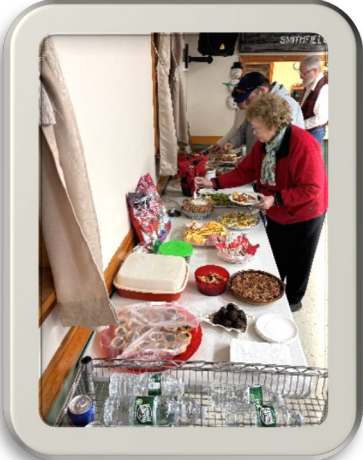

Thankfully we have been able to continue the delivery of food & necessities to Smithfield residents in 2025. We deliver once a month to Smithfield households.

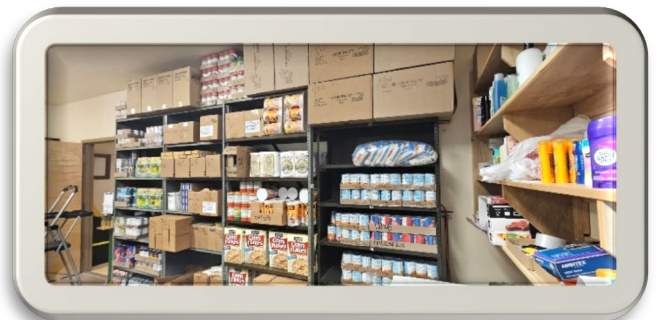
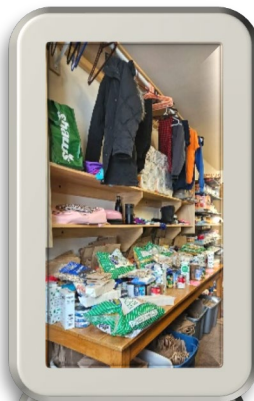

# Smithfield Planning Board

## 2025 Annual Report

In 2025 the Smithfield Planning Board worked diligently to complete the work on the town's comprehensive plan which was started the previous year.

Special thanks is due to Gloria Kelly who put in many hours editing in order for us to reach our deadline.

The board also reviewed several building applications as well as met with others intending to build/expand in preliminary meetings to help clarify the sometimes-confusing ordinance adherence process. As always, the board encourages the public to attend meetings and bring any questions regarding ordinances and procedure to the board.

A summary of the application review for 2025 is:

- Two commercial applications for minor expansion to an existing commercial site which were approved. Both applications were for the same site but separate applications.
- A shoreland application to replace an existing structure was approved.
- A shoreland application for an addition to the primary structure was approved.
- A shoreland application for a new conforming residence was approved.

The board has also drafted a fertilizer and pesticide use ordinance for the shoreland zone to help protect our lakes by trying to prevent use of chemicals most likely to run off into the lakes and to address proper use of these chemicals when used.

# SOMERSET COUNTY

## *Maine*

Somerset County Government is proud to serve the public good by providing services to our nearly 52,000 residents every day. County governments are making news around the state as budgets come under scrutiny. In 2025, the Somerset Budget Committee approved a county budget that had no net increase to the taxpayer.

The County Commissioners are committed to making decisions with the property taxpayer in mind. In the spring of 2025, the county partnered with the Kennebec Valley Council of Governments (KVCOG) to provide regional Code Enforcement services to towns with populations under 4,000. The program is up and running with services being offered in several Somerset towns.

The County invested \$15,000 in Code Enforcement Software to help KVCOG streamline the permitting process. This was one of several Community Benefit grants awarded by the Commissioners. \$280,000 in grant funding was awarded to 26 groups representing 16 communities in Somerset. Applications for the next round of funding need to be submitted by May 8, 2026. More information on the Community Benefit Matching Grant program can be found on the county website <https://somersetcountyme.gov/funding-opportunities/>

In late 2025 District 2 Commissioner Cyp Johnson stepped away from his seat as he moved out of the district and could not continue to represent the Towns of Madison, Anson, Starks, Smithfield, Mercer and New Portland. A special caucus of municipal officers was held in November. Don Skillings from Madison was appointed to fill the vacancy. The District 2 seat will be up for election in the fall of 2026 along with Districts 3, 4 and 5.

Long time Emergency Management Director Mike Smith retired at the end of 2025 with over 25 years of service to the County. Eric Plourde also joined the ranks of the retired after serving in Somerset's I/T department for 15 years. We wish them the very best in their new ventures.

Working with the selectboard, we were able to find the perfect spot, right next to the park and ride. We were so happy to help get that parking lot put in a few years back, but we never foresaw that someday it would set up the perfect location for our new improved facility. The only caveat to the move was that it is temporary. We may have to pick it all up and move it....somewhere. We have our fingers, toes and everything possible crossed hoping the town members will vote to allow us to make this location permanent. A permanent designation will allow us to put a roof over the units. The roof will give us that fully protected area to do our repair work, protect the containers themselves and improve the aesthetics of the facility.

Thanks to our amazing team of volunteers we were able to pull all this off just in time for snow to fall. Winter 2025/2026 has been one of the best we've had in years. Here's hoping for an even better 2026/2027!

Polls are open from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. with the Registrar of Voters present to correct lists of voters.**

**The Inhabitants of the Town of Smithfield qualified to vote in Town affairs are hereby warned to assemble at the Municipal Building (926 Village Rd) at six o'clock (6:00 p.m.), March 14, 2026, to act on Article 3 to the end of the Warrant.**

**Art. 1.** To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting.

**Art. 2.** To proceed with voting by secret ballot as directed and provided by statutes, on election of Town officers.

#1 Article #64

**W. Fertilizer/Pesticide/Chemical Uses**

**1. Purpose and Justification:**

To amend the Shoreland Zoning Ordinance section 15 Land Use by limiting the use of fertilizers and certain pesticides in the shoreland zone. The intent is to limit the movement of water-soluble fertilizers and pesticides into our lakes and streams.

- a) The use of granular pesticides on lawns is prohibited within the shoreland zone and within 75 feet of any stream or wetland unless applied by a licensed pesticide applicator with the 3B Turf Category from the State of Maine.
- b) No fertilizer shall be applied within 100 feet of a shoreline or stream in the shoreland zone.
- c) The use of fertilizer on lawns within 100 to 250 feet of a lake or great pond is restricted to the following conditions.
  - i. Application follows the best management practices as described by the Maine Board of Pesticide control, limiting the potential for nutrient runoff or groundwater infiltration.  
([https://www.maine/dacf/php/pesticides/applicators/best\\_management\\_practices.shtml](https://www.maine/dacf/php/pesticides/applicators/best_management_practices.shtml))
  - ii. Fertilizer use is restricted to a minimum of 50% slow-release nitrogen.
  - iii. Fertilizer must be phosphorus-free.
  - iv. Application rates may not exceed 0.5 lb. total nitrogen /1,000 sq.ft., within annual maximum of 1.5 lb. nitrogen/1,000 sq.ft.
  - v. With the exception of section a(i) above, fertilizer restrictions may be waived by the Planning Board or their designee upon submission of written justification addressing the need and specific locations within the property where the request applies.

**2. Definitions**

- a) Fertilizer: Any substance containing one or more recognized plant nutrients which are designed for use in promoting plant growth such as nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium. Fertilizer as defined shall not include nitrogen-free soil building products such as molasses, humic acid, kelp, soil biological stimulants, secondary macro-nutrients, micro-nutrients, and biological inoculums.
- b) Granular Pesticide: A dry solid pesticide that is applied to soil or lawn for the control of unwanted pests or weeds.

**Section 12 Non-Conformance**

B. Non-Conforming Structures

2. Foundations.

a. Construction of a new or enlarged basement or foundation requiring soil excavation within twenty-five (25) feet of the normal high-water line of a great pond or stream or the upland edge of a freshwater wetland is prohibited. The prohibition applies to, but is not limited to, basements, frost walls and slabs. It does not apply to post foundations or replacement foundations and basements.

b. Whenever a new, enlarged, or replacement foundation is constructed under a non-conforming structure, the structure and new foundation must be placed such that the setback requirement is met to the greatest practical extent as determined by the Planning Board or its designee, basing its decision on the criteria specified in Section 12(C) (3) Relocation, below. *If the completed foundation does not extend beyond the exterior dimensions of the structure, except for expansion in conformity with Section 12(C)(1) above, and the foundation does not increase the structures height by more than three (3) additional feet, it shall not be considered to be an expansion of the structure.*

**Summary of Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Smithfield**

The points listed below are a very brief summary of the sections covered in the 2026 Comprehensive Plan. **Section 1: History of Smithfield:** Prior to European settlement, the area that would become Smithfield was inhabited primarily by the Norridgewock band of the Abenakis. The town was first settled by Europeans in 1799 with the establishment of a sawmill, and the population now hovers just under 1,000.

**Section 2: Growth & Development:** In recent years, Smithfield's growth has been due to its popularity as a vacation destination, based on its proximity to East and North Ponds. This has also led to some commercial growth. Over the past 5 years, Smithfield has seen a significant increase in the total evaluation of the real estate in town of 51.71% and now falls in the median of property value increases among the neighboring towns.

**Section 3: The Economy of Smithfield** is tied very much to the two lakes within it.

- The two significant employers in town are summer camps with over 100 seasonal employees each.
- The average business in town employs fewer than 5 people each.

**Section 4: Government Facilities and Services:** The town of Smithfield, like many other agreements, and citizen volunteerism to meet its public service demands. This includes Fire Protection, Emergency Medical Services (EMS), and Police Services.

- **Smithfield is part of a School Administrative District (MSAD/RSU#54)** that provides educational services for Pre-K-12 students in the towns of Canaan, Cornville, Mercer, Norridgewock, Skowhegan and to Smithfield.

**Section 5: Natural Resource Conservation and Management:** Smithfield consists of 19.9 square miles (12,700 acres) of land area. Adding in the area of the lakes, Smithfield's total area is over 25 square miles. Residents of Smithfield have indicated that water quality and the preservation of open space are major concerns.

**Section 6: Land Use and Development:** Private property and its various functions hold significance for both individuals and the broader community. While there is generally little desire to intervene in private affairs, concerns arise when an individual's actions on their property have implications for neighboring residents, property values, or municipal expenditures. As towns consider regulations, they must weigh the interests of private property owners against the need to maintain environmental quality, public health, and overall community well-being.

**Section 7: Cooperation with Neighboring Towns and Agencies:** The actions taken by neighboring towns as they deal with development and public service issues give Smithfield opportunities for mutually beneficial cooperation. The surrounding towns and agencies provide Smithfield with access to schooling, emergency services, public safety, solid waste, water protection and conservation.

**Section 8: Action Plan:** It is important to remember this plan is not law. Adopting this plan will not force the town to follow the plan as suggested. It is simply a guide to consider in order to meet the expected changes the town will face in the next 10 years and how the town can best prepare for those changes in ways that benefit the community as a whole.
